It was followed by a session on Indian medical graduates and their sensitization to the goals, roles and global competencies developed by the MCI/NMC . How to link national health needs to competencies and objectives was also discussed.



Report for FDP - Cancer Biology

The faculty professional development program titled "Cancer Biology" has been conducted successfully from 4th to 10th February, 2020, at Index Institute of Dental Sciences, Indore. A total of 66 members from the faculty participated in the program via Zoom platform. The 7-day program, held in-keeping with the purview of World Cancer Day, opened with the address from the Honourable Vice Chancellor, Malwanchal University, Indore - Shri N. K. Tripathi, highlighting the huge menace caused by the disease in the whole of the country. Thereafter, the program directed to develop an understanding of oral cancer and how it is prevented, diagnosed, and treated. It introduced the molecular biology of oral cancer (oncogenes and tumour suppressor genes) as well as the biologic hallmarks of the same while describing the risk factors for the disease worldwide. The instructor, Dr. S. Prabhu, a renowned expert in the field of head & neck cancer and microvascular reconstructive surgery, explained how oral cancer is staged, the major ways cancer is found by imaging, and how the major cancers of the head & neck are treated, with major concerns towards the rising incidence and disease mortality with respect to oral cancers in India.

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The course comprised of 6 modules. The first module emphasized on the identification of major types of cancers. The second module helped inculcate the understanding of how genes contribute to the risk and growth of oral cancer. In the third module, cellular hallmarks of the disease were discussed. Module four defined metastasis, and identification of major steps in the metastatic process. Module five included discussions over the role of imaging in the screening, diagnosis, staging, and treatments of oral cancer, and in module six the participants examined the variety of treatment options available to patients as well as the features of clinical trials and how they are used to improve the treatment arsenal.

Overall, the program was highly successful with great interactive inputs from all the participants. It ended on a high note with a closing speech from the honourable Dean, Dr. Satish Karandikar.

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REPORT FOR FDP MEDICATION ERROR

The Faculty Development Programme was schedule between 05/03/2021 for 2 hours per day, the programme was conducted by Dr. Sangeeta Maheswari .This programme was organized to enhance the knowledge and for the development of the faculties. The seminar was conducted .in room no. 2 of DOP.

The topics are covered in her session are as follows:

- 1. Types of medication error
- 2. Causes of medication Error
- 3. Factors contributing to medication error
- 4. The 6 R's

On first day she started her session with the general introduction on the topic medication and medication error. She explained the definition of medication and medication error. A medication is a product that contains a compound with proven biological effects, excipients etc. A medication error is defined as "any preventable event that may cause or lead to inappropriate medication use or patient harm while the medication is in the control of the healthcare professional, patient, or consumer." She continued her session by explaining the types of medication errors. The types of medication are as follows:

- **Prescribing**: In this type she explained that the physician has prescribed a wrong medication to the patient. It can be any mistake happen by the prescriber like age of patient, gender of the patient etc. These factors mainly affect on the medication errors.
- Wrong time: This types errors occurs when the patient has taken his medication at wrong time. Like some medicine or drug has to taken before meal, but if the patient consume medicine after meal it will lead to some errors.
- Improper dose: In this type of drug the patient consume improper medication like instead of taking 5ml of cold syrup, patient took 10ml of syrup.
- Lack of awareness of expiration dates: Although expiration dates are printed on the bottle or label, many patients do not pay attention to the date and consume drug the expiry of the drug.

On second day she took her session on the topic causes of medication Error, in this she explained that the most common causes of medication errors is improper communication between the doctors and patient. And the others causes of medication errors are:

A. Errors of omission:

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Errors related to prescription: Any mistake happen by the prescriber like age of patient, gender of the patient etc.

<u>Drug dispensing by pharmacist</u>: In this errors may cause while dispensing the medication, the patient gets changed.

<u>Drug administration by the patient</u>: This type of errors can cause when the patient does not administered his or her medication in proper way.

B. Errors of commission: most common form of errors encountered in clinical practice, include wrong phenomenon, drug interaction related, communication failure, overuse of drug.

On third day she took her session on the module factors contributing to medication error are as follows:

- Lack of knowledge of the prescribed drug, dose, patient details: This type of errors
 occurs when the pharmacist does not have the proper knowledge about the drug and
 its dose and also about the patient details like his age or gender.
- Illegible handwriting: This is the most common factors where the pharmacist was able to able to understand the handwriting of the physician, and by getting confused he dispensed wrong medication.
- Confusion with the drug name: some drugs which have same pronunciation but have different mechanism leads to medication errors, while confusing by these names of the drug the pharmacist dispense wrong medication to the patient.
- Inappropriate use of decimal point. This factors also cause medication errors, in this
 type the pharmacist was confused in the decimal point and he dispensed the wrong
 dosage to the patient.

On fourth day she took her session on the topic The 6 R's. The 6 R's are as follows:

- 1. Right patient
- 2. Right drug
- 3. Right dose
- 4. Right time
- 5. Right route
- 6. Right documentation

These are the 6 R's which will avoid the medication errors.

At last day of the session she guided the faculties to avoid these all the factors and cause to avoid medication errors.

Culturally Inclusive Teaching

Culturally inclusive education connects the subject matter to the cultures establishing a personal connection., information, then use examples and exercises to connect their study topic to different cultures. Flexible Learning Environments

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Teachers should know how to use their classrooms for different instructional approaches. For example, when teachers are willing to change the furniture around in the classroom, they may discover that it is a critical variable for boosting student learning.

Flipping

- 2-Value involves a student's ability to perceive the importance of engaging in a particular task. This gives meaning to the assignment or activity because students are clear on why the task or behavior is valuable.
- 3-Cost points to the barriers that impede a student's ability to be successful on an assignment, activity and/or the course at large. Therefore, students might have success expectancies and perceive high task value, however, they might also be aware of obstacles to their engagement or a potential negative affect resulting in performance of the task, which could decrease their motivation.
