Event Details: Value Added Course "Patient Safety- Our Mission "

Duration: 15 hours Report Date: 18<sup>th</sup> January,2022

Preventable patient harms, including medical errors and healthcare-associated complications, are a global public health threat. Moreover, patients frequently do not receive treatments and interventions known to improve their outcomes. These shortcomings typically result not from individual clinicians' mistakes, but from systemic problems -- communication breakdowns, poor teamwork, and poorly designed care processes, to name a few.

The value added course on "Patient Safety -Our Mission' covered the concepts and methodologies used in process improvement within healthcare system. Participants developed a system's view of safety and quality challenges and learnt strategies for improving patient safety out comes which include, diagnosis, medications, surgical operations, infections, and injuries.

National Patient Safety Implementation Framework (2018-2025) was discussed in depth and the current scenario and future directions were emphasized on. Implementing patient safety framework would require a holistic and pragmatic approach. Patient safety concepts should be interlaced with building blocks of health system so safety culture becomes integral part of healthcare delivery. Six strategic objectives have been identified as per National Patient Safety Implementation Framework for this purpose. The strategic objectives are:

Strategic Objective 1: To improve structural systems to support quality and efficiency of healthcare and place patient safety at the core at national, sub national and healthcare facility levels.

Strategic Objective 2: To assess the nature and scale of adverse events in healthcare and establish a system of reporting and learning.

Strategic Objective 3: To ensure a competent and capable workforce that is aware and sensitive to patient safety.

Strategic Objective 4: To prevent and control health-care associated infections.

Strategic Objective 5: To implement global patient safety campaigns and strengthening Patient Safety across all programmes.

Strategic Objective 6: To strengthen capacity for and promote patient safety research

Mr Javed explained that the goal is to improve patient safety at all levels of health care across all modalities of health care provision, including prevention, diagnosis, treatment and follow up within overall context of improving quality of care.

Dr. Deepti Agnihotri highlighted the importance of critical values in patient care and timely action. A critical value is defined as an imminent life-threatening laboratory result requiring immediate physician notification. Regulatory agencies and federal legislation require that hospitals and laboratories establish a list of critical tests and values and have procedures in place for promptly conveying critical results to the responsible practitioner. of critical values has potential for failure, as demonstrated in the medical literature. Standardization of processes related to critical tests, results, and values can positively affect quality of care and patient safety. First, facilities must develop a critical test list and identify critical values or results. Next, implementation of processes that identify critical values and mechanisms to quickly document and communicate critical values to healthcare providers caring for the patient may reduce harm to patients.

The speaker gave the following suggestions for establishing a facility-specific critical value list:

- Ensure committee representation from various departments, including the medical staff, laboratory staff, and nursing staff.
- Customize the critical list as directed by the laboratory medical director, who has primary responsibility for the laboratory specimens list.
- Consider the needs of special programs in the facility, such as cardiac surgery, bone marrow transplant, or high-risk obstetrics.
- Post the critical laboratory test list in all areas of the laboratory.
- Review and revise the critical values list and related policies annually to maintain compliance with regulatory agencies.
- Educate laboratory staff on the critical values list annually.

Dr. Rahul Kirodi focussed on safe blood transfusion practices. Blood transfusion is safer than ever before through continued improvements in safe donor recruitment, screening of donors, testing of donated blood and appropriate clinical use of blood. The risk of residual infections is further reduced through inactivation of pathogens in blood components. Prevention of technical and human errors in blood grouping, avoiding bacterial contamination of blood components and using leuco-depleted products to minimize immune modulatory effects also increase blood safety. For safety, efficiency and effectivity it is necessary to improve clinical transfusion practices through alternatives to traditional hemotherapy such as autologous transfusion and audit of blood utilization practices by hospital transfusion committees.

Dr. Pithawa spoke about the importance of informed consent in todays world with increased chances of litigation. A strong patient doctor relationship requires a trust, but informed consent is a must. The main purpose of the informed consent process is to protect the patient. A consent form is a legal document that ensures an ongoing communication process between you and your patient. It implies that you have given the patient information about his/her condition and treatment options and that they can this information to choose the option that they feel is right for them.

Restrain have been using the reasons for protection patient from injury, maintaining treatment, and controlling disruptive behavior. It was thought that without the restraint, patients could be in danger of injuring themselves or others. However, it is a legal issue that when and how use the restraints. The overall purpose of the next session was to understand the significant policies of restraint intervention in health care setting.

Advanced technology has opened new horizons to diagnostics and interventional radiology, nuclear medicine and radiotherapy. While this has improved patient care, inappropriate or unsafe handling of radiation technology can also pose potential health risks for both patients and health workers. There is a need to maximize the benefits while minimizing the harms.


In next session Dr. Pankaj Gupta discussed radiation safety policy, ALARA principle (As Low As Reasonably Achievable) and duties of radiation safety officer. He emphasized on safe hadling and storage of radioactive materials. All rooms intended to be used for the storage, handling, use or disposal of radioactive material must be approved by the Radiation Safety Committee and will appear as authorized locations with appropriate signage. Radioactive material must not be stored, used or handled in any location other than these locations.


The last session focussed on counselling and communication skills which are a must know for rendering quality healthcare services. Patient education and counseling is a critical part of medical practice. It should be incorporated into the overall plan of care, and the process should be documented in the medical record. It should include opportunities for the patient to discuss their feelings and provide feedback to the clinician.

Mr. Javed Ali explained that patient education and counseling session should be done in a quiet and insulated environment, free of distractions. The session covered use of both verbal and non-verbal communication. This was followed by an interactive session and atest to evaluate the understanding level of the participants.
